



Watch Night Service At Macedonia



2018 Membership Registration

Registration is extremely important! Since our last registration, members have left our church, changed addresses, phone numbers, and in some cases, last names. We must update our records to reflect these changes. In addition, members may need to take a new photo.

If you value your membership with this church, please make every effort to preserve it. Registration will be held in the Atrium beginning Sunday, January 7, 2018, after the 8:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. worship services each Sunday for six weeks. A \$1.00 fee will be assessed to defray the cost of registration.

The By-Laws pertaining to annual registration, Article 1, Section 7, are as follows:

Every member must register in person during the first six (6) weeks of every new year. Provisions will be made for members who are unable to register in person due to illness, military duty, and educational leave.

Any person desiring to register whose name is not found on the current membership list, must offer themselves as a candidate under Article 1, Section 2.

Your failure to register in person by Sunday, February 11, 2018, will indicate that you



no longer consider yourself a member of this congregation. The termination of individuals from the church role will include the forfeiture of all rights and privileg-

es associated with membership, including weddings and funerals.

PSYCHOLOGY OF HOLIDAY SHOPPING

- In one study of children's letters to Santa, it was found that in all cases children asked for only material items in the 855 letters that arrived in a Seattle post office.
- A study found that children often received more gifts than requested, especially preschool children, who requested an average of 3.4 toys and received an average of 11.6 toys for Christmas.
- Decking the halls with the spirit of the season is also an important year-end tradition, as 87 percent of people surveyed say decorating improves their spirits during the holidays.
- Decorations account for about \$46.73

 of spending, greeting cards average out
 at \$26.52, floral arrangements hold at
 \$18.23, and cherished Christmas trees
 average out to \$42.00 in consumer
 costs. Surprisingly, gift-wrapping costs
 for consumers equates to \$2.6 billion
 worldwide. Lastly, a generous slice of
 holiday costs is allocated to food and
 candy, contributing to \$96.75 of holiday
 expenses.
- 86 percent of adults surveyed believed in Santa Claus as a child, with the average age being at 8 years old when Santa is revealed that he "isn't real." Only 15 percent of children believe in Santa past the age of 10.
