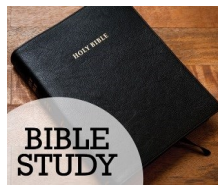

ARK ENCOUNTER



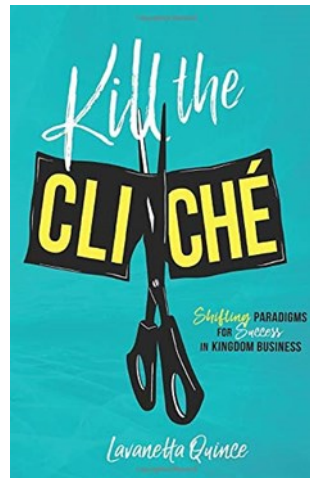

WHY YOUR DEBIT CARD IS THE LEAST SECURE WAY TO PAY FOR YOUR GOODS

Chances are you pay for most everything with either a debit card or credit card. Whether it's your seamless order, your internet bill, or your morning cup of coffee, you likely pull out that piece of plastic and swipe without giving it a second thought.



In fact, according to the Federal Reserve's 2019 Federal Reserve

Payments Study, total card payments grew to 131.2 billion transactions in 2018, totaling \$7.08 trillion. That's up from 29.7 billion transactions totaling \$1.56 trillion in 2015.

But that simple swipe can open you up to a world of hurt. That's because magnetic stripes, the black bars on the back of your credit and debit cards, are among the least secure payment methods around, leaving you at risk of fraud.

And if you frequently use your debit card, you could end up giving criminals access to your bank account. That's because unlike credit cards, debit cards use money from your checking or savings account. And if a criminal drains your account, you could end up waiting days for your bank to reinstate your cash, leaving you high and dry.

The best way to stay safe? Use services like Apple (AAPL) Pay, Google (GOOG, GOOGL) Pay or Samsung Pay, which are among the most secure payments methods, if you can find them.

Magnetic stripe cards have been around for decades. And they've got their benefits. "The pro...is that you can pretty much use it anywhere," explained Paige Hanson, Chief of identity education at Norton LifeLock on payment security.

"But there is a lot of risk involved, because the magstripe itself, all of that credit card information is static, and it's unencrypted," she said.

Swipe cards are so fast and convenient because a lack of encryption makes them easy for point-of-sale terminals to quickly read and get you on your way. But that's also the biggest flaw.



When you swipe, the card reader gets a snapshot of your name, card number, and expiration date. If a criminal has installed a card skimmer in a point-of-sale terminal, they can extract all three of those pieces of information to make online or in-person purchases.

PASTOR TWYMON'S 40th ANNIVERSARY

On Sunday, March 22, 2020, Macedonia honored our beloved Pastor Charles D. Twymon for his 40 years of commitment and service to Macedonia Baptist Church.

Pastor James Jones, Pastor Claude May, and Pastor Raymond Willis were present at either the 8:00 or 11:00 service. Pastor Carl Livingston was unable to attend because he was on military duty in Rockford, Illinois.

Pastor Twymon, dressed in a tuxedo, was escorted into the 8:00 a.m. service by his granddaughter, Raven Twymon. He was escorted into the 11:00 a.m. service by his younger granddaughters, Kennedy and Madison Twymon dressed in identical floral dresses. First Lady Loraine Twymon was under the weather and unable to attend. The Mass Choir, directed by Pastor Willis, sang at both services. Pastor May officiated, beginning with a warm welcome and introducing the speakers at the eight o'clock and eleven o'clock services.

8:00 a.m. service began with *The Pastor's Biography* read by Sis. Mary Ann Windham and the *Pastoral Appreciation* delivered by his daughter, Candice Twymon.

The guest minister was Pastor Robert Mills of Puritan Ave. Baptist Church. His sermon was titled "*Planted For Purpose*," Psalm 1:1-3.

Pastor Mills referenced the man who does not walk, stand, nor sit with the ungodly, a comparison to Pastor Twymon who refrains from deliberately becoming involved with those who will not adhere to the Word of God in speech or action. He is like the tree who is planted and not placed, to become foundation connected, strong, sturdy and steadfast. Nourished in the Word, he knows his purpose is to provide shelter and covering in life's storms to those seeking salvation. Pastor Mills closed with a message to his friend to keep standing on God's Word and promises.

The 11:00 a.m. service began with Pastor May asking the congregation to stand, point to Pastor Twymon and say, "We thank you for still standing but not standing still." This generated a standing ovation by the congregation. Sis. Joi Danforth read *The Pastor's Biography*. Sis. Michele Petty read the *Pastoral Appreciation* in the absence of her mother and Pastor's aunt, Mother Audrey Watson, whose building is on lock-down. Even though Sis. Petty delivered the appreciation, they were the actual words of Mother Watson.

Our guest minister was Pastor Jake Gaines of Synagogue Baptist Church. A dynamic, educated, scholarly and very impressive speaker. His sermon was titled, "*For A Very Long Time*," Galatians 6:9. Throughout his message he emphasized the significance of the number 40, which is a special number that describes the journey; it represents a very long time. For example, Jesus wandered in the wilderness and fasted for 40 days. 40 years of leading others, including his wife and family and his willingness to make sacrifices; 40 years of trials and tribulations. He described Pastor Twymon as a friend and colleague, a mentor and great preacher "for a very long time." He also saluted First Lady Loraine Twymon for 40 years of being by his side. Above all, Pastor loves God! "I love you man. I salute you for doing this for 40 years".

Pastor May thanked the 40th Anniversary Committee—the Twymon children, who were responsible for selecting the guests. They did an outstanding job selecting such dynamic speakers.

Macedonia preachers, Rev. Bell, Rev. Register, Rev. Davis, Rev. Shumate, and Rev. Minor expressed their appreciation to Pastor Twymon with remarks and gifts.

Pastor Gaines remarked that Pastor Twymon may never know the number of people he has touched and encouraged through the years because of his excellence and commitment.

Pastor Twymon thanked the Macedonia ministers, the 40th Anniversary Committee, and everyone for making the sacrifice to be here, stressing the need to come together to pray and repent. After the service we were treated to a delicious catered meal.
