

Blanche K. Bruce

Blanche K. Bruce was born a slave in Farm-ville, Virginia, in 1841. His family later moved to Missouri, where he received his formal education. He then studied at Oberlin College in Ohio. After moving back to Mississippi following the Civil War, Bruce worked as a planter and entered politics. He held a number of local offices, then was elected to the United States Senate in 1875, becoming the first African American to serve a complete six-year term.

In 1875, when Blanche K. Bruce delivered his speech before the U. S. Senate, the struggle for equality was losing ground. The national resolve to protect African American rights had waned. Southern whites were beginning to seize power again. That power brought with it laws that stripped African Americans of their rights. If laws worked too slowly, violence and intimidation were used. Soon, a new system was instituted to replace slavery. It was called segregation. The dream of equality for the African American had turned into a nightmare.

Black inventors

Everyone may know about George Washington Carver, but there are so many more Black inventors who have contributed much to our way of life. Here are just four:

Lewis Howard Latimer: Invented and patented the carbon filament, so light bulbs would last longer than those with a paper filament designed by Thomas Edison.

Sarah Boone: An African American dressmaker, she made her name by inventing the modern-day ironing board. With its approval in 1892, she became one of the first Black women to be awarded a patent.

Garrett Morgan: Love them or curse them, you can thank 46-year-old inventor and newspaperman Garrett Morgan for the three-position traffic signal. "Though Morgan's was not the first traffic signal (that one had been installed in London in 1868), it was an important innovation nonetheless: By having a third position besides just 'Stop' and 'Go,' it regulated crossing vehicles more safely than earlier signals had."

Marie Van Brittan Brown: If you sleep better at night and when you're away from home because you have a security system, you should know it was invented by a Black woman. "Marie Van Brittan Brown felt uneasy in her neighborhood and the police were unreliable. So, she took matters in her own hands and patented the modern home security system." Over 50 years later, the technology is installed in millions of homes and offices worldwide.

JESUS AND THE MUD PUDDLE

Howard County Sheriff Jerry Marr got a disturbing call one Saturday afternoon a few months ago. His six year-old grandson, Mikey, had been hit by a car while fishing in Greentown with his dad.


The Soul of Christianity

sharing and gifting.


When you meet someone for the first time, they might ask, "Who are your people?" and "Where are you from?"
