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# CONGRATULATIONS MACEDONIA ON YOUR 102<sup>nd</sup> Church Anniversary

Theme: "A Church Kept by God," Psalms 121:5 "The Lord is thy keeper: the Lord is thy shade upon thy right hand."

On Sunday, September 25, 2022, at the 11:00 service, Macedonia celebrated its 102<sup>nd</sup>Church Anniversary. Pastor Terry Minor invited Pastor Wallace Mills of New Ebenezer Baptist Church to deliver the message. Pastor Mills is a long-time friend of Macedonia who has been affiliated with Macedonia since he was a child when Macedonia was on Evline Street. The Macedonia Choir provided us with up-lifting spiritual music.

Pastor Mills delivered a powerful message on the topic, "A Church Protected by God" Psalms 27:1-5. We were truly blessed. He emphasized that the reason Macedonia is protected by God is because God has been faithful to Macedonia and the members have been faithful also. He said God is willing and able to handle every situation if you let him. Stand on the promises of God—he'll fight your battles. For 102 years Macedonia has been protected by God.

This anniversary represents a milestone and the beginning of a new era in Macedonia's history. For 102 years, Macedonia was blessed to have three pastors and three church buildings. The three pastors were Reverend Forest D. Mills, Reverend Junius A. Watson, and Reverend Charles D. Twymon. The three church buildings were located on Evaline Street in Hamtramck, Belmont Street, and Southfield Road. Today, in 2022, we have our fourth Pastor--Pastor Terry Minor, who was installed on June 26, 2022. We also have a fourth building—the Macedonia Baptist Church North Campus.

Because of the pandemic, many church programs were discontinued. But under the leadership of Pastor Minor, several programs have resumed--Bible Study, Macedonia Choir, and Children's Church.

Ministries which will be coming soon are the Men's Choir, Church Nursery and the Angelic Choir.

Macedonia has been blessed through the teachings of our *four* pastors. Physically we've come a long way. The first church building in 1920 used contact paper to simulate stain-glassed windows and a pot-bellied stove generated the heat. Our current building has air conditioning, an elevator, and a beautiful new addition. Macedonia has survived not because of its church buildings but because of its ancient landmark values, spirituality, and principles. Macedonia continues to believe in what the past and current pastors founded the church on—the Word of God.

# Study: Too Much TV, But Not Computer Screens, Increases Dementia Risk

Older adults who get a lot of "screen time" may have an increased risk of developing dementia but a lot depends on what type of screen they use, a new study suggests.

Researchers found that among older British adults, those who spent a lot of time watching TV were more likely to be diagnosed with dementia in coming years, yet the opposite pattern was seen with computer use.

Experts stressed that the findings do not mean that TV watching causes dementia, or that browsing the internet will protect your aging brain. But the study does argue for exercising both your body and your mind, said lead researcher David Raichlen, a professor at the University of Southern California, in Los Angeles.

In general, he explained, research suggests that physical activity supports brain health as people grow older - possibly even lowering the risk of dementia. By extension, it would seem that being a couch potato is a bad thing.

Fewer studies have actually looked at that premise, but some have found that sedentary people may see their memory and thinking skills wane faster as they age.

However, people can be sitting yet mentally active, Raichlen said, TV watching could be considered "passive", while some other activities - like reading or computer use require some mental engagement.

"Sedentary behaviors that are more cognitively active might have some benefits', Raichlen said.

To dig into that idea, his team used data from the UK Biobank, a large research project collecting health and medical information from half a million British adults.

The researchers focused on over 146,000 participants aged 60 and older who were dementiafree at the outset and reported on various lifestyle habits, including how much of their daily leisure time they devoted to TV or computers.

Over the next 12 years, just over 3,500 participants were diagnosed with dementia. And the more TV time they reported at the study's start, the higher that risk: For each hour people typically watched per day, the risk of dementia rose 24%.

That was after the researchers had accounted for various other factors, including peoples exercise and diet habits, body weight and education level, and whether they smoked or had chronic health conditions.
