

Just Two Minutes of Vigorous Exercise Boosts Longevity

Two minutes burst of vigorous activity totaling 15 minutes a week reduce the risk of death, according to research published in the European Heart Journal. Study participants ages 40 to 69 with no vigorous activity had a 4 percent risk of dying within five years, but their risk was 2 percent with less than 10 minutes of weekly activity, and 1 percent with 60 minutes or more. "Accumulating vigorous activity in shorts across the week can help us live longer," said study author Matthew N. Ahmadi, PH.D., of the University of Sydney. "Given that lack of time is the most commonly reported barrier to regular physical activity, accruing small amounts during the day may be a particularly attractive option for busy people."
